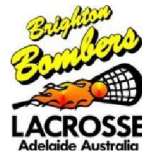

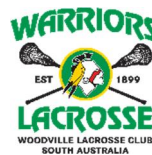

Executive Officer's Report

I am privileged to have the opportunity to work with so many dedicated and passionate people. These include the club representatives, volunteers, players, coaches, and officials, supporters and the Lacrosse SA Board and staff. I would like to thank our major sponsor Graham Hobbs - Living Choice Australia for their continual support and valued contributions and the Crows Lacrosse Club for their donation this year. I would like to acknowledge the support received from the Office of Recreation and Sport, and the South Australian Government.

We have made some significant steps forward, delivered improvements in many areas and identified some areas that still require attention. In the not too distant future, I'll be finalising the LSA club Handbook. We are fully aware that for those that have ever served time on club committees, keeping on top of administrative requirements is always demanding. Dealing with due dates, and the fulfilment of administrative responsibilities is challenging at the best of times for most time poor volunteers. It became obvious very early in my tenure as EO that we as an association needed to put something in place to alleviate some of the time pressures through communication and sound structure. The club handbook forms a guide to all LSA's administrative requirements in a way that will allow clubs to operate in an organised consistent manner, hopefully reducing the stresses between clubs and head office.

For a small sport, we always seem to be "under the pump", administratively speaking! It is this very reason that I spend much of the time in my role seeking more efficient pathways. While the day to day running of lacrosse in SA is somewhat a "hurdles event", it is our successes that need to have our focus to retain a positive outlook! This year we have had many things to be proud of. Hosting of the 2015 U18 National Championship tied in with the Australian Club Championships brought nationwide accolades to our association. Much was learnt from hosting this event and that knowledge will only stand us in good stead for the next National event in 2016. I also draw pride from the people within our community that choose to be involved at HP level both nationally and especially internationally. I have an understanding from conversations that the time and financial demands placed on these individuals is great. I wish to convey my respect and gratitude for all that have represented our association this year. At a local level, the finale of the season just past, both for seniors and juniors were a resounding success. Finals is without a doubt, the busiest and most stressful time of the year. To witness such fabulous and well attended culminations is something our whole community can be proud of.

President's Report

The role of President of LSA in 2015 has been both challenging and rewarding!

I took up the role after the resignation of John Fuss in May 2015 due to health reasons. Many thanks must go to EO Giulia Marion and LSA board members for their assistance with briefs on all issues in the Presidents portfolio. It was quickly apparent, the need for the investigation and implementation of structural and procedural changes to ensure the efficient administrative viability of Lacrosse in SA. Many of these changes e.g. Bylaw review, framework for preseason changes and administrative efficiency reviews are mid process with a target for completion prior to the 2016 season.

June 2015 saw the formation of the ALLF (Australian Lacrosse Leaders Forum) with the first meeting being held in Perth coinciding with the Senior National Championships. This forum provides a platform for communication between the 3 major Lacrosse states and ALA. The guiding principle was to finally break historical trends to improve the way in which lacrosse is governed from a National level using feedback from state associations and to then follow up by imposing accountability to the national governing body. A second meeting followed in September. Some examples of discussion points later leading to action items from these two meetings include:

- The role of ALA? What do MA's receive in return for fees paid to the national body?
- Lacrosse governance structures. Is lacrosse in Australia over governed?
- Possible changes in ALA's primary focus. HP/National Tournament versus Growth
- Structure of National Championships
- Funding

Work in this area in ongoing, how we progress as a state association in the national arena is reliant on a change in mindset at the top level.

With funding from Office for Recreation and Sport, LSA's new Strategic Plan was formulated. It was important to recognise that the new plan rose from the thoughts and ideas of the SA Lacrosse Community. Jeff Dry facilitated a planning day whereby members of the lacrosse community came together to highlight all that is good and the areas requiring improvement within SA. Information was sorted and ranked in terms of importance to form the outline of our new plan. LSA's Strategic plan, 2015 to 2017 is now the roadmap for the board and sub-committees. Focus will be directed towards seeking further funding to achieve goals as set out in the new plan.

The overriding theme of my time as President thus far is the need for succession planning. On all levels be it competition, administration, playing space, club financial strength, officiating/coaching education and many other areas it is absolutely vital that we challenge the current knowledge to better the sport in SA. Communication and cooperation are that foundation stone on which we will achieve strength and ensure a bright future.

Lastly I would like to offer my thanks, again to the board and staff of LSA but primarily to the volunteers at club level to which the sport owes a continuing debt of gratitude.

Deputy President/Director of Administration Report

During 2015 (Feb – Nov 2015) the role of the deputy president covered an array of key areas for Lacrosse SA's (LSA) development. These are outlined below:

1. Governance structure
Previously there was oversight where changes in the board governance structure had not been formally approved. Operations are to be dealt by sub-committees within the LSA strategic plan, constitution and by-laws followed by ratification by the LSA board. Governance structure improvements for 2015 and future years include:
 - Board meetings
All portfolios are to submit a report each board meeting, providing streamlined approach to board meetings, with recommendations outlined.
 - Framework for Review and amendment of rules
To be outlined within a document provided to clubs for clarification surrounding the process. Currently this is a working document and has yet been ratified by LSA board.
 - Framework for South Australian U15 Team Program Policy
2. Constitution review and changes
The improvement of the board's efficiencies as a result of change in governance structure is required to be reflected in the constitution. Currently the board is receiving expert advice to undertake a sound review and provide comprehensive constitution.
3. By-law Review
It had become apparent throughout the year that inconsistencies and contradictions within the LSA by-laws required resolving. Clarity regarding intent and interpretation is also required. While competition committees recommended changes the board could consider, the undertaking of the by-law review on the 15th November was to ensure all clubs had an opportunity for their suggestions to be heard.

By-laws of particular note
 - Number of overseas players (to be reviewed again along 2019 – 2022 strategic plan)
 - Re-compense fees for transferring players
 - Playing in two senior grades within the same round (in relation to loan player agreements)
 - Formalise by-laws in relation to movement of players between divisions within the same grade
 - Formalise by-law regarding umpire/referee selection for major rounds
4. Staff Review
It is a priority to align position descriptions of staff, Executive Officer (EO), Administration Officer (AO) and Development Officer (DO), as a result of the change in governance structure and the 2016 – 2018 strategic plan. An annual review processes for each position will also be included and mandated.

Director roles position development
 - Handover phase: leaving director is to provide elected director with relevant information to provide smooth transitions within that particular director's role.
 - Align director roles and terms of reference with 2016 – 2018 strategic plan, by-laws and constitution
5. Development Report
The Development Report is the board's alternative to compliancy. The intent of the report is to provide LSA with information to better direct assistance and facilitate development of lacrosse players, in particular junior participants. The development report will run as a pilot program for 2016 and will be provided to clubs once the document is ratified.

As the position of deputy president is open to consideration for 2016/2017 I would hope to see the board's desired changes covering governance, constitution and by-law review and changes, staff and director review and the development report be carried out. I'd also like to thank Scott and Giulia as well as the other board members who have assisted my role throughout the past year.

Director of Finance Report

The following 2 pages are details of the financial statements (**subject to audit**) for the 12 months concluded on 30th September 2015 - prepared on an accruals basis. Accruals basis means income still to be received after 30th September, but relating to the 2014/15 financial year is included (and is shown in debtors in the balance sheet) - and conversely expenses paid after 30th September but relating to the 2014/15 financial year are included (and shown in the balance sheet as creditors).

The "bottom line" shows a pleasing \$11,644 surplus for the year. You can analyse from the statements which income or expense items have gone up or down from the previous year. It was resolved this year not to have separate state team player levies and incorporate virtually all Club charges into team nomination fees. We are grateful to the Crows Lacrosse Club of past players for the generous donation of \$3000 to Lacrosse SA earlier in the year.

The Club debtor amounts shown in the balance sheet were the amounts outstanding as at 30th September. The sundry creditor amount is mainly referee and umpire payments from the 2015 season which have been paid after 30th September, and also the fees for the hire of the SACA grounds at Park 25.

- By-Laws 2.5 and 2.6.1
- Adelaide University development plan
- Division 1 & Division 2 game times
- FIL Rule changes
- Penalty structure/consequence
- Umpire feedback forms/process

There has been significant time spent at the meetings discussing the way the existing By-Laws 2.5 and 2.6.1 have been administered and the effect it would have on some SL and Division 1 teams if 2.6.1 was adhered to. Lacrosse SA has sent information regarding the above By-Laws and several others to the clubs for discussion and comment.

I would like to thank the club representatives for their continued attendance and due diligence when discussing the agenda items each month.

Congratulations to the Australian team and State team representatives, State League, Division 1 and Division 2 Premiership teams, club and association award recipients, and finally to all the players and officials who achieved milestone games in 2015.

A draft of the 2016 Women's State League program has been circulated along with the Men's State League program to club reps and secretaries for review and comment, with similar drafts to follow shortly for the Division 1 and Division 2 competitions based on the team numbers from this season.

I feel it is imperative that we all work together to grow all forms of our great game.

Thanks to Adelle for chairing this committee for the majority of the year and to the other board members of Lacrosse SA for their support during 2015.

Men's Competition Committee Report

Firstly, I would like to congratulate the clubs and the countless volunteers involved in hosting ALA sanctioned events and Lacrosse SA finals, secondly to the Australian team representatives/coaches/staff, State team representatives/coaches/staff, premiership teams, club and association award recipients, and finally to all the players and officials who achieved milestone games in 2015.

This year the Men's competition meetings were well attended, and I encourage all clubs to seek out representatives who will attend meetings to provide input and represent their club and views with due diligence. This committee makes recommendations to the board on the information provided by your club representatives.

The initial 2015 program for all the Men's grades took several weeks to finalise with input and comments provided by the club representatives, this was eventually compromised after the season had commenced, with clubs opting out of the Division 1 competition and relegating their teams to Division 2, this created some scheduling issues that were unavoidable.

A draft of the 2016 Men's State League competition has already been circulated to club representatives and secretaries for review and comment, with similar drafts to follow shortly for the Division 1 and Division 2 competitions.

I feel it is imperative that all forms of our game be reviewed and developed, this is where every club, player and official needs to become proactive, with recruiting, rule development, promotion and marketing, we are all involved with this great game so let's work together to keep it great.

Director of Junior Competition Report

This report covers the period from the Nov 2014 to the November AGM 2015.

During this time the Junior Committee has continued to operate in a manner fostering open communication, critical thinking and 'best practice' decision making when considering the management and development of Junior Lacrosse in SA. As a collective group the JCC has been committed to adopting a broader perspective to develop the sport. The aim is to provide the best opportunities for young people to learn and enjoy Lacrosse & flourish in the sport. Specific Target Outcomes for the 2014-2015 period included:

1. Produce an evidenced based documentation outlining the Rule progression across the junior grades (boys and girls) from u8/11 connecting with senior lacrosse in SA. This includes a rationale of how this structure supports player development and learning.
2. Update all junior rule documentation in a standard format including philosophy, guidelines and clarity in the rules.
3. Improving the visual web page to feature each of the junior events.
4. Competition Events for 2015
 - 4.1 **The O week concept.** The aim of O week was to provide support for players, officials and coaches to come together prior to the start of the formal competition. This is to promote better understanding of rules, to assist the development of officials and to foster communication between coaches.
 - 4.2 **Celebration of Lacrosse:** This served as the North and South U 8/11 culminating event for term 2. However it also provided an opportunity for other u13 juniors to participate in this celebration at park 25 and Glenelg.
 - 4.3 **Junior Girls (2) divisions.** The aim to generate two divisions in each of the junior levels for girls – to foster even competition and promote new players/ teams entering the sport.
 - 4.4 **Junior Finals.** Successful events operating in the Junior finals series with the stand alone GF day a feature.
 - 4.5 **Boys Lacrosse.** A focus in planning leading into 2016 as a result of participation and event structures in 2014.
 - 4.6 **Inter Schools trophy lacrosse – girls** Additional school teams (Wilderness, Walford, St Peters, and Seymour) in 2015. Luke Oswald established the Judy Thurgood Interschool's trophy. Wilderness winners in 2015.
5. **U 15/18 National Events**

Ongoing discussion relating to the philosophy and the management of this event were addressed once again. Follow up (again) with the ALA to clarify the orientation/ philosophy of this tournament and its structure. Highlight the need for management structures and processes to be in place earlier at local level to ensure a more coherent framework.
6. **Promotional material / recruitment**

Ongoing from report in 2014. Identified as a priority area for 2015 and beyond in order to develop and realise growth in the sport. Need for promotional materials, plans and strategies from ALA and LSA board to support this.

Systematic Operational Plan for Growth needed
As outlined in the Nov report to LSA Board a key point of improvement relates to 'bigger picture' systematic planning from LSA Board – Development linking with Junior structures. Specific Plans for development need to be mapped out, operationalised with a funding source in order to direct projects in order to assist clubs in recruitment and growth. This is essential to ensure a coordinated approach to all lacrosse opportunities available across the year and for a short/ long term development plan.

Development Report

Work in this once again centred on the facilitation of school based clinics. First term as in previous years saw the highest concentration of Development Coordinator engagements with SAPSASA events acting as culminating events in most cases. These events continue to be well patronised. Southern Zone held at Sturt Lacrosse club where 500 students competed in 66 teams from 12 schools. Northern Zone held at North Adelaide Lacrosse club where 250 students competed in 30 teams from 7 schools. . Tea Tree Gully SAPSASA sporting carnival was another big lacrosse event again this year where lacrosse clinics were rolled out for 600 kids from 14 schools. . Marilyn is currently in talks with the organiser in an attempt to start a mini lacrosse competition in that area during the summer school holidays to raise awareness and recruit. These events are play a large part in exposing the best of lacrosse in the SA school system. Planning will begin for an addition Primary school event to cater for increased numbers.

The **Australian Council for Health, Physical Education and Recreation (ACHPER)** run sporting carnivals each year during PE week where Lacrosse plays a part, we get to showcase our sport to over 10 schools. This benefits new PE Teacher/Development Officer relationships vital in forging new school ties.

Growth of the Junior Girls competition continues an upward trend. The introduction of two divisions in each of the girl's grades provides an attractive platform for new teams to enter an established competition. Multi divisional age groups have shown to be a positive growth tool earmarked for other areas of concern. Winter Competition school team involvement breakdown:

- U8 Mixed: **10 teams** (5 north, 5 south, Inc. 3 school teams)
- U11 boys: **12 teams** (4 north, 8 south, Inc. 1 school team)
- U11 girls: **17 teams** (10 north, 7 south, Inc. 6 school teams)
- U13 boys: **6 teams**
- U13 girls: **13 teams** (7x Division 1, 6x Division 2, Inc. 5 school teams)
- U15 boys: **5 teams** (including 2 x composite teams)
- U17 boys: **4 teams** (including 1 x composite team)
- U18 girls: **9 teams** (5x Division 1, 4x Division 2, Inc. 1.5 school teams)

Total: 88, Inc. 20.5 school teams

We acknowledge we need to increase work in the area of junior boys growth. Development and Junior Competition portfolios will take on responsibilities to this effect. Junior girls schools program are a marked area of growth, continued work on the IGSSA program has seen lacrosse taken up by 6 out of 10 affiliated colleges. Developing beneficial club/school relationships shown to be an important marker for success.

Lacrosse Growth Advisory Council heads up the work to add lacrosse to the School Sports programs for 2016. An Australian Sports Commission funded program whereby schools choose from a selection of preferred sports as part of their PE curriculum. It is the aim of the council to have lacrosse on the preferred list further opening avenues for exposure.

University based competition events, driven by Luke Oswald continue to provide lacrosse programs at tertiary level. Many thanks must go to Luke for his effort and enthusiasm for growing the sport.

Compliance has long been a highly contested issue for lacrosse in SA. 2015 brought a change in thinking as to how LSA can ensure the ongoing development in Junior Lacrosse whilst moving away from the existing "punishment" based compliance rules at the request of a majority of clubs. 2016 will see the implementation of the Club Development Plan reporting program. This program has been developed with the aim of capturing vital information about club based development work for analysis to take a more targeted approach to the utilisation of development financial allocations and use of physical resources. Communication to clubs will follow shortly. Thanks to Adelle Craig for her work in this area.

Lastly, many thanks to LSA Development Officer Marilyn Fuss for her infectious enthusiasm and energy in the area of recruitment and development.

In conjunction with Eloise Willmore we have updated our coaching data bases to ensure all coaches at a senior level are on FOX SportsPulse with correct information. Currently I am approaching all State league coaches regarding RPL for the *Club Coaches'* course in preparation for the release of the next level of coaches' course release.

In preparation for 2016 we are looking at introducing some coach the coaches 1 day courses with specialist coaches presenting and demonstrating.

In closing I'd like to thank Giulia & Tiff for all their administrative work that helps support me with my role on the Board and also like to thank all the other directors on the board for their support as well and I wish the next Coaching director all the best in what is a very fulfilling role.

Director of Officiating Report

As Officiating Director I am truly saddened with the lack of respect and trust shown to Umpires and Referees. Our senior Umpires/Referees are all volunteers and have shown that they can uphold the rules and have passed many exams and tests to prove that they know their craft. However they are continually abused questioned and ridiculed by anyone and everyone. If we do not stop this type of abuse from our teams and spectators the ranks of our top official's s will slowly diminish.

Senior grade officiating this season as in the past is becoming a major problem. Clubs are not supplying Umpires/Referees as per the Lacrosse SA by-laws. Season 2015 saw a decline in people that officiate consecutively in senior grades other than State League. This situation cannot continue into next season and I fully support the use of fines to clubs who do not provide umpires/referees as per the bylaws. The practice of rostering on anyone to go and umpire/referee just to avoid fines etc. is not helping grow our officials' pool or the game. Neither is the expectation for one or two umpires to cover all grades. Clubs should be responsible for providing umpires that have read and understand the rules - how to blow a whistle when to blow a whistle. This is paramount if our game and the people that play if they are to be kept safe. With retirements of some senior umpires/referees we need to keep the pool of knowledgeable ones growing.

Umpire training nights were held with moderate success and ALRA SA are also in a similar position. Help/training was available to all umpires every game day. Accredited umpires resat tests and we had a few new umpires also sit their exams but unfortunately none of them were assessed due to the fact that clubs never put in assessment requests. With very few assessors the need to make requests for assessing is important. Seven women's umpires were given their junior accreditation and I congratulate them on a job well done. Hopefully next season will show an increase in participation at all training, which will be done well before the beginning of the season.

We also had two junior club umpires that attained State Accreditation. Due to the way we have altered the rules and no longer play ALA rules the only way Umpires can gain higher accreditation from Junior or club is to travel with State teams. Maybe it's time as a State Association we review the way we officiate our women's game. It is lessening the avenue for our umpires to gain their accreditation. It is also lessens the numbers that can gain accreditation in a given season.

Our national teams were all supported by umpires and referees when they went to play in their championships/tournaments. Thank you to the Officiating parties that travelled with the teams. I would like to congratulate all Officiating award winners this season.
