Executive Officer's Report

2006 was another very busy year for Lacrosse South Australia. Some aspects of the year were very positive, others not so.

Highlights and activities included :

Australian Lacrosse League

- The inaugural year of this competition saw the opening round played at the Pines Hockey Stadium in November 2004. The assistance of many saw Lacrosse SA stage a successful weekend of lacrosse.

WLA Senior Women's National Championships

- Disappointing that we could not put together a team for either the original date in July, or the revised date in September. No doubt there were many reasons for player's lack of interest—some understandable, never-the-less this is a major concern. The Championships were eventually cancelled altogether
- Burnside Lacrosse Club and Helen Keane did an excellent job of running the Championship despite the challenges of holding such an event over Easter

Inaugural Summer League Competition

- This was organised by a player's committee and proved to be a very popular pre-season event

Visits by Overseas teams

- Ritsumeikan, Doshesha, Kobe Shoin Universities and Okayama Prefecture
- These visits provide coaching, playing and umpiring opportunities for LSA personnel and allow us to play a significant role in developing lacrosse in Japan
- Considerable planning to increase the number of visits has taken place during the year

WLA Under 21 and Under 17 National Championships in April

- Another successful event run this time by the Woodville Lacrosse Club and overseen by Helen Keane

SA's representation in the World Cup winning Australian Women's Lacrosse team

- We were very proud to have eight playing representatives and an assistant coach in this team, and an Umpire officiating at the event
- Follow-up to the win included a highly successful Film Night attended by the Minister for Sport, Receptions at Government House and the Town Hall and appearances at Football Park for an AFL match and at Hindmarsh Stadium for an A League Soccer Match.

State Under 19 Men's Championship and Under 17 Zone Boys Tournament in Melbourne in July

- Four members of our Under 19s selected in the All Stars Team following the championship

A great STX League Grand Final

- Brighton and Glenelg put on a great display of lacrosse, with Glenelg winning

The National Indoor Lacrosse Championships will be held around Australia day, January 2006 at the Blackwood gymnasium. This is a Lacrosse Australia sanctioned event, with national coaches looking for squad members for the next Australian team to play in the 2007 World Indoors. Sharni Wilson- Smith has been appointed as Tournament Director to work with Sturt Lacrosse Club as hosts to ensure the good running of the event. Helen Keane is representing the board and providing welcome assistance and advise.

The combined U-19 men's National Championship and U-17 Regional Tournament will be held at Woodville lacrosse in July of 2006.

The year 2005 will be remembered as the year the Australian Women's team won the World Championships, a feat of mammoth proportion. LSA is very proud of our eight girls who represented us and achieved the ultimate lacrosse player's dream, may I use this report to again offer my personal congratulations to these eight South Australian champions.

The women's "STX" competition in its current format must surely have a huge bearing on the skills our girls have obtained and we as the lacrosse sport administrators must ensure we keep this competition viable and encourage all clubs to become part of it.

My biggest concern this year, and for the immediate future, is the decline in junior numbers. Any sport which can only field two under 13 boys games each week must consider itself to be in crisis for its future.

I urge ALL of our Lacrosse fraternity to take responsibility for this and to help in recruiting junior players, in any way that is available to them for the future of the sport in South Australia.

I personally believe that for far too many years we have revolved our sport around the traditional established clubs. Attempts have been made in the past to start up clubs in areas where there are large numbers of young families. Clubs such as Southern Districts, Tea Tree Gully, Modbury and Salisbury have at some time been fully established by dedicated, hard working lacrosse people only to see them disappear, one of the main reasons being that the older established clubs do not want to travel across our city to play. To progress our sport we must all work at overcoming this short sightedness and re-establish these areas again, advancing our sport to the wider community.

The changes made to our junior representative teams and the way the senior state teams are now being conducted has put a considerable amount of extra work onto the LAXSA Board and the Lacrosse office. We are now required to find a minimum of twelve coaches and managers every season and then work with each one of them in the management of their duties. While a very rewarding task in many ways it has become an exceptionally time consuming one. I believe the board needs to look at appointing a person who will oversee all state teams in a mentoring capacity, reporting directly to the Board even to the point of making it a Board Directorship.

This year's board membership will again change dramatically due to resignations and terms expiring; I take this opportunity to thank those who are leaving us for their dedication to our game and their friendship during their terms.

Secretary's Report

Congratulations to the winners of all premierships and national titles, individual awards at both Association and Club level, players, coaches and the many others who made up our representative teams.

My main focus as Secretary of Lacrosse SA has been on updating our By-Laws. This has been a very slow process and little progress has been made.

Two by-law changes were made for season 2005. We have modified the Overseas player by-law (By-Law 6) to clarify the restrictions in the League teams, and we modified the introduction (1), affiliation (2) and sub-committee (2.3) by-laws to, hopefully, be simpler.

Our By-Laws seem to always create contention. Different people are able to interpret the by-laws in different ways. This has led to two resignations from the Board in recent times.

One such by-law that always raises questions is that regarding qualification for finals. Over the years we have tried to use various systems, including percentages of games in the different grades, but currently it is a simple matter of the NUMBER of games played by the player in the different grades that is used for determining eligibility. The numbers of games that are scheduled for the grade is irrelevant.

As a Board, we are bound by the Constitution and By-Laws that we have. I believe that we need to make them clear enough so that all members can adhere to them, while allowing some flexibility to allow "common sense" decisions to be made where circumstances not specifically catered for occur. This is not an easy task.

My thanks to Steve Smith and Rob Clark for their assistance in the By-Law review thus far.

Congratulations to Helen Lewis and her team of helpers for their organisation of this year's Awards Night. Last year was excellent, but Helen and her team excelled even that high standard with another quality event of which all lacrosse people can be proud. I am sure the sponsors and other guests were most impressed.

Women's Competition

2005 was a pretty good year for Women's lacrosse in SA. On the international stage, we had eight representatives in the World Cup winning team, nationally our senior state women brought home the trophy again, we successfully introduced a twilight summer league, and the local winter competition, for the most part, ran pretty efficiently.

The STX Committee—made up of players and coaches from the participating teams took greater ownership of the management of this competition, which was good to see. In the latter part of the year, given that a 6th club team seems unlikely, options were looked at to create a sixth team to participate in this comp. It's hoped those discussions continue and bear fruit. Congratulations to Glenelg on taking out the STX final to the STX All Stars team and thank you to Graham Hobbs and Roger Attenborough for their continued sponsorship support of this competition.

This season we welcomed back Uni SA who carried all before them in the B Grade competition and a second B Grade team from Glenelg—congratulations to Glenelg on some creative recruiting from softball, which saw virtually a whole team of newcomers to lacrosse join the competition. Overall, we were one team up on 2004.

Congratulations to the Reserves Premiers (Brighton), the B Grade Premiers (Uni SA) and to all who won trophies and achieved personal milestones.

Steve Smith resigned from his Board position as Women's Competition Director—effectively immediately, at the end of the season. He has done a great job with this portfolio in recent seasons—thanks Steve and to all the Women's Competition Committee members for their commitment to representing their clubs. Thanks also to Bob Hewitson who assisted Steve this year at Park 25 - setting up and putting away equipment every Saturday, to our evergreen Registrar Margaret Pallant and to all the Players, Coaches, Officials and other volunteers who continue to make the our women's competition successful.

Men's Competition

Season 2005 saw the League introduce overtime and sudden death to achieve a result when scores were tied at the end of normal time, this produced some exciting finishes to several games.

Congratulations to all the Premier teams, Association award recipients and clubs that hosted finals.

Congratulations to every player that achieved milestone games during the year.

Thanks to the members of the Men's Match Committee for their diligence and approach to the season and input at meetings as delegates of their respective clubs and our continued efforts to structure a fair and equitable draw for every team. Special mention to Brighton, Burnside, Glenelg and Woodville for their willingness to participate in the Wednesday night games.

At this stage of the year the program for 2006 has already been formulated along with the structuring of an Indoor contact season set to begin in February.

Junior Competition

I have the pleasure of presenting my first report to the Lacrosse South Australia Community.

First and foremost I would like to thank the club representatives on the junior competition committee for their contribution to the development of lacrosse within the wider community. The role of junior coordinator at a club level is diverse and time consuming. The competition committee met on a regular basis with all club representatives providing valuable input in a cooperative and supportive manner.

Further refinement was made to the rules governing junior lacrosse, with a standard easy to read format developed. Significant support was received from not only the junior competition committee but representatives from ALRA and SAWLA. The junior competition committee looks forward to working closely with the state umpiring bodies in future years.

Standardisation in start times was implemented into the junior girl's competition in 2005 with set finishing times trialed during the season.

A desire to increase participation time for children in the U11 competition saw a move to one game with an extended game time, cutting down on loss of game time between games.

A comprehensive review of new rules implemented in 2005 will be conducted in due course.

Team nominations for 2005 continued on the trend of 2004 in seeing a significant number of combined teams. Overall there was a decrease of four teams in the junior girl's competition, (three less teams in U11's, two less teams in U13's and one new team in the U15 competition).

The junior boy's competition saw a one team increase from previous years and it was pleasing to see Prince Alfred College enter a team in the competition through the Adelaide University Lacrosse Club. Further support from the Association in 2006 will see Prince Alfred College develop into a competitive team.

Limited success was seen from our junior teams in national championships and tournaments during the year. A review of the selection process, appointment of suitably qualified coaches and lead time will need to occur to ensure South Australian juniors are given the maximum opportunity to succeed and have the opportunity to represent Australia and travel overseas.

I would like to extend my thanks to the Board of Lacrosse SA and in particular my fellow competition directors and to Helen Lewis and Bob Hewitson for their support.

To the club volunteers, parents, coaches, managers and players, thank you for your support in further developing the sport of Lacrosse in South Australia.

Development

2005 saw Lacrosse SA take up a number of opportunities for development from the Active After Schools Communities program, the Primary and Secondary Schools Carnivals, to developing a schools lesson plan and the launch of the new logo.

Trish Adams has again done a sterling effort throughout the year. Trish's included report outlines the tasks undertaken and completed this year and highlights the level of input she has. In the main, Trish managed this role without the direct support of the Director of Development.

I have took up the Director Development role late in the year, and am looking forward to the challenge ahead. This role, as per the Strategic Plan 2004-2006 is to establish pathways for elite players and to promote lacrosse in schools and the community. The work undertaken by Trish with schools, as noted above, has given us an excellent springboard from which to further promote, and introduce new players to our great game. A small amount of training is involved to help volunteers gain skills in supporting school children with the clinics. Trish manages much of the bookings and initial contact with the schools and the more support from clubs the better the result.

This position, as all the Director positions on the Board and all members of the lacrosse family, is important for our long term growth, sustainability, and viability. It is important we all recognise the roles we play within the lacrosse community and work together in promoting and growing our sport. Active After Schools Community Project

This project is an initiative by the Federal Government to encourage typically inactive kids to get motivated for sport and physical activity. Lacrosse has been involved since the program began in term 2. This commitment usually means being involved in an eight week program, 1.5 hours per week, run after school hours.

Deliverers must complete a training course which is free of charge and takes two days (some recognition for prior learning applies).
