### Executive Officer's Report

2009/10 was another busy year for Lacrosse SA. The demands on the Association and its Member Clubs continue to grow in so many ways and areas. Compliance and appropriate governance is becoming more and more arduous, not to mention the ever present challenges of the recruitment and retention of players, officials and volunteers. Not having a full complement of Board Members, which we haven't for some years, is challenging for the Board itself, and for the Office, as each has to take on extra responsibility. The Board has spent some time this past year considering its structure and operations to ensure it remains focussed on strategy and optimum efficiency in the decision making process, and it would be great to have a full complement of members after tonight.

Highlights / Activities for 2010 included :

- i-lax – Social Mixed Indoor competition, played at Westminster College. Thank you to Coordinator Jayne Bartholomew.
- Men's Indoor Competition, once again organised primarily by Chris deMello
- National Indoor Lacrosse Championship. Played in Adelaide between SA and Vic, won by Victoria.
- The combined the Men's and Women's Pre-season Super League played at Barratt Reserve.
- Continuation of the High School competition in Term 1. As a result of this Competition, Rostrevor College entered Under 18 and Under 15 Boy's teams in the Winter Field Competition, under the banner of the East Torrens Payneham Lacrosse Club. Well done to Coordinator Luke Oswald.
- Annual SAPSASA Lightning Carnival. 38 Girl's and Boy's school based teams competed in the South West Carnival at Barratt Reserve.
- Japanese Camps. These are a joint venture between Velocity Lacrosse/Trish Adams and LSA and see teams from Japan visiting SA for training and matches.
- New Development Role. We had recently experimented with some different models for the Development Officer role and this year we reverted to employing an office based Development Coordinator on a part time basis and welcomed Marilyn Fuss to the LSA team
- We applied for and received a grant to take on a trainee and Kate Schouten commenced in that role in March.
- The victory of our Under 21 Women at the National Championship in Sydney. Well done to Coach Bec Hakendorf, Manager Judy Evans and the team.
- The continuation of our mixed gender Under 8 competition. Great fun for players and spectators alike, and a great development/recruitment opportunity for Clubs.
- Australian Club Championship played at Finsbury Lacrosse Field on the June Long Weekend. Once again we thank Graham Hobbs and the Eureka Group for their generous support of this event. The Brighton Lacrosse Club won both the Men's and Women's Club Championship.
- The performance of our Under 19 Men's Team at the National Championship in Perth. Second by the narrowest of margins.
- The ALA Rising Stars Under 15 National Tournament. Without a Club willing to run this event, the planning and delivery was taken on by a small committee of LSA Board Members and Volunteers, and Staff. The intent was to keep it structured but straightforward and we believe this was achieved. We thank Rising Stars for their sponsorship of this event, and for their ongoing assistance in making the travel arrangement for our travelling teams.
- The performance of our Girl's Red Lightning Team at the Under 15 Tournament. Undefeated until the Grand Final, and then going down by one goal. Great work by the Girls, Coach Andrew Young, Assistant Coach Lauren Guerin and Manager Tania Chin. This is very much a development tournament, and the work by all players, coaches and managers was first rate.
- The victory of our Senior Women at the National Championship in Melbourne. Made even more pleasing by the fact that the team included many young players, experiencing lacrosse at this level for the first time. Well done to Coach Peter Mathwin, Team Manager Allyson Guerin and the Team.
- Mark Polden, Director, Officiating being named as a finalist in the Officiating Category for Sport SA's Volunteer of the Year Awards. The winner will be announced on November 20th.

- Star Club. As well as the traditional development tasks of clinics and recruitment, Development Coordinator Marilyn has the responsibility of Club Development. The intent of this program is to ensure that all clubs are running as efficiently and effectively as possible, and to hopefully create some consistency of approach in all Club Management matters. We are trialling the Office for Rec and Sport's Star Club program, which is yet to be evaluated
- Once again we are proud of our Playing, Coaching and Officiating representation at the International level, whether it be in an Australian team, or a developmental team. All of these people are listed later in this report, and we congratulate them all.

Many things have been achieved this past 12 months, but there are always things we can do better. We still have many young players, especially girls, playing multiple games on a Saturday. While sometimes this is by want, it is sometimes by necessity as clubs struggle for numbers. There are some shortcomings when it comes to on-line match and player data entry. The player data is very important as it is used for a number of reports, including this one, and needs to reflect our numbers as accurately as possible.

Coaching Director Lynton Arscott has made great inroads into improving the State and Zone Coaching and Management appointment process, but we need to get these appointments and teams organised earlier. Sponsorship is down this year, and this must be addressed next year. We are continuing negotiations to ensure that Finsbury Lacrosse Field offers the best possible option for lacrosse on artificial turf, not only for Women's State League. The updating of our bylaws must be finalised. Some have been revised and uploaded to the web, but there is still much work to be done.

But to end on a higher note, it has to be said that generally speaking, the work done and commitment shown by so many for our sport is outstanding. "For the love of the game" takes on a whole new meaning when you talk about lacrosse and its aficionados. Well done to the many volunteers who keep the game, its events and its players up and running.

As always I am indebted to the many people who continue to support and assist me in my role, which seems to get broader every year. Thank you to President Greg Hamilton, and all of the Board Members, Immediate Past President Bob Hewitson, (very few people realise just how much Bob does in so many areas), Club Secretaries, Women's Registrar Margaret Pallant, newcomers to the staff, Marilyn Fuss and Kate Schouten and our Administration Officer Tiffany Smith.

Junior development has been a board focus and the Under 8/11 competition played on Saturday mornings at Park 25, saw the player numbers grow to the point that we ran out of grounds and equipment. Congratulations to the JCC and all members who assisted with running this program, a fabulous result for 2010. To extend this growth and interlace the 8/11's with their next step - U13, we are re-introducing the lightning carnival concept with the decision made to present two carnivals for the U8, U11 and U13 age groups. Planned as a series of Family Days filled with lacrosse activity, the timing options being investigated are for competition in the two weeks prior to the April school holidays and for the second and third Saturdays of the July school holidays. The JCC will be running the competition on behalf of LSA and the member clubs and they will certainly welcome any assistance you may offer.

Through our Competition Committees and with the assistance of the Development Director and his sub-committee, much time has been spent developing the idea of bringing games, "Back to the Club". In 2011 the ideal is to incorporate one game per round of the Women's State league games at home grounds on a Saturday and for the U8/11 to play in a regional structure of games at each club. The introductory programming detail for seasons 2011-13 is under development, this trial will have to be flexible with the idea that over a three year period the resources at clubs can build and our capacity for future growth will be enhanced.

### Women's Competition

Firstly, I would like to say thankyou to those involved in women's lacrosse for the continued faith that they have put in me to direct the Women's Competition Committee for the year 2010. I would also like to thank Glenelg, Women's Competition Representatives and the Lacrosse SA Board for their ongoing support and assistance in some of the decision making that has occurred. I would like to thank my children for having the faith in me to maintain the household and continue to feed and run them to various trainings as well as allow me the endless hours that seem to be necessary to keep the WCC functioning, and finally I would like to thank my husband Scott for his unhindered support, love and devotion and for being the sounding board when I need to have someone outside the game to run things past.

I would like to congratulate all the clubs on their successes this year in recruiting and continuing to support the women's game in any way, shape or form. Women's Lacrosse in South Australia is unique in that we play a different code of the game at the most elite level while still encouraging the development of the game in Div 1 and Div 2. Yes we introduced the concept of Div 1 and 2 at the commencement of the season and over the season it became entrenched in the game where we are now referring to Div 1 and 2 more consistently than the old "Reserves" and "B grade".

Congratulations to Brighton for winning the League and Div 1 premierships and North Adelaide for winning the Div 2 premiership this year. A first for a long time for the North Adelaide Club. Congratulations also go to Brighton for winning the Australian Club Championship.

The League continued to play out at West Torrens (Finsbury) and while the games were generally of a high standard the spectator numbers were down (I could often count the number on both hands and rarely had to use my toes), and the facilities were even less inviting that in 2009. The wet and cold season didn't make it any easier and we had to make a decision to use a cover over the scorer's bench as the long awaited grand stand is still no closer in being started, let alone completed.

Games continued out at Park 25 with the work progress for the tram line extension hindering parking to some extreme. Thankyou to those who persevered this season and hopefully the conditions will be easier for parking in the 2011 season.

Some achievements that should be noted for the season 2010 are

- Senior Women who won the Australian National Championships in Melbourne. Congratulations to Peter Mathwin, Allyson Guerin and the team for their success.
- Australian club Championships which was won quite convincingly by Brighton.
- U21 State Team which won the National Championships against Victoria in a nail biting time on and then sudden victory match. Congratulations go to Bec Hakendorf and the team for their success.
- A review of the League women's rules which is ongoing and I will see to the end despite my retiring from this position.
- The loan system which allowed Woodville to field a team this season.
- Sturt who will be making a step up in 2011 to the League competition.

Things that could be improved:

- It would be nice to have a 6th/7th team in the league competition,
- For senior women to only play in one game per week/round
- For the competition to be based around SA players and not the overseas players.
- For the grand finals of all grades to be played on the same day
- Training and retention of umpires across all grades

Once again thankyou for the opportunity to lead the Women's competition for the last two years and while part of me would like to continue on, the role is quite demanding and I look forward to doing what I intended to do when I retired from teaching, so farewell and see you on the field next year.

### Junior Competition

Ladies and Gentlemen, May I submit to you my report for 2010.

I decided at the beginning of the year to take on the role of Acting Director – Junior Competition as no one else had volunteered for the position, and in my opinion, it is one of the most critical portfolios in terms of the long term success and more importantly, viability of the sport of Lacrosse in SA.

Two elements of this portfolio were critical to ensuring this viability – continuous club involvement in the decision making process around the Junior Competition and the increase in numbers in the most Junior grades.

To comment on the latter first, it was with great excitement that after the first couple of weeks competition of the Under 8 and 11 grades, we were at maximum capacity in terms of teams playing and available space at Park 25, as many clubs had made a real effort to increase their representative teams in these grades during the "off" season. Accompanied by parents and supporters, Park 25 was packed from 8.30am – 9.30am every Saturday morning.

This also saw the introduction of another "school -based " team in the competition as Loreto College (Burnside) entered a team in the Under 11 competition. On this note, it was also pleasing to see Rostrevor College (ETP) enter a team in both the Boys Under 15 and 18 competitions as a direct result of the High School competition. They played their games on a Sunday ( to avoid compulsory School sport on a Saturday). This was able to occur with the full support of the Junior Competition Committee and therefore the individual clubs who re-arranged their teams in order to compete on a Sunday. It was also pleasing to see that many clubs tried to "even " up the game at times by giving players to these developing teams as well as giving these players extra "coaching" in the finer points of the game.

The challenge for these teams is now to consolidate and/or expand for the 2011 season, and as a competition we need to maintain this flexible and accommodating attitude in order to cater for these teams.

The collaborative nature of the JCC was displayed many times throughout the year with many decision made during the year for the betterment of Lacrosse in SA after consultation with their clubs.

Decisions such as:

- Extending the playing time for Under 11s
- Introducing a policy of evening up competition if one team was more than 10 goals in front
- Playing the Rostrevor teams on a Sunday
- Playing a double round one weekend to accommodate State team travel to Perth

These are just a few examples of the way the JCC worked this year, along with informed discussion at all meetings, with these members truly representing both their clubs and Lacrosse in general.

Although as a result of amazingly inclement weather, the stand-alone Junior Grand Final Day was a run-away success in terms of games played and the number of spectators in attendance, including many Senior players from those clubs involved. Certainly something to think about as a concept for next season.

In 2010, compliance was also a major point of discussion at the beginning of the season with a new "contract" system being introduced for teams unable to field teams in the required grades. Contracts were introduced to ensure that these clubs "grew" their junior number overall and/or ran internal competitions to this end. Compliance will always cause angst among clubs, whether they fulfill the team requirements or struggle to achieve it, but it is a necessary evil to ensure that clubs focus on their Junior development throughout the year. A club that starts thinking about recruiting Juniors in March has left it too late.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank members of the Junior Competition Committee for their commitment (almost full representation for all meetings), enthusiasm and their willingness to work together in order to make the Junior competition a better one.

We have a long way to go, but I look forward to building on the successes of 2010 in order to have an even stronger and bigger competition in 2011, with the challenges being accommodating ever increasing number of U 8/11 teams, school based teams and compliance. Hopefully in 2011 I won't be acting though!

### Development

LSA created the new Development Coordinator role for season 2010. This was a result of discussion at Board level and with the Office for Recreation and Sport, with LSA receiving funds to support the role. The key concept behind the role is to work across the association supporting all clubs with a club development focus. The Starclub, an initiative of the Office for Recreation and Sport provides a suite of tools and ideas for clubs to access for the growth and development of their club.

*A STARCLUB is a well-run club where quality coaches and officials work alongside valued volunteers in a safe and welcoming environment.*

*Measure your club against the STARCLUB criteria and get information and support to continue the development of your club to provide the best environment possible for your members and the wider community.*

Marilyn Fuss has taken up the Development Coordinator role and has commenced implementing the Starclub process with two clubs. LSA encourages all clubs to consider the Starclub Development Programme.

We also welcome Kate Schouten to the Trainee Development Officer role. Kate has been working closely with Marilyn delivering many clinics and programmes to schools. Kate and Marilyn have both attended a number of training and development sessions and have supported numerous people through the Active After School Communities training allowing them to deliver programmes to over 30 schools. This is a fantastic achievement and we look forward to clubs converting as many of those students into registered club members as possible.

The High Schools Competition was changed slightly this year after recommendations from the previous season. This competition again was very successful with teams progressing to the winter field competition. Thanks go to Luke Oswald and his team of helpers for ensuring the ongoing success of this competition.

With the anticipated increase in Velocity League teams for season 2011, and the squeeze on Park 25 due to the expanding competitions LSA needed to address where and when matches would be played each week. A sub-committee was formed to investigate the Junior and Women's Competitions in relation to grounds and the logistics in general. A 'back to clubs' approach was taken with the view to how we could

have women's' and girl's games played at club home grounds. At this stage we are looking at a range of games being played at club grounds, bringing the U8-11 to a regional competition over the coming seasons and what the implications of such a shift would bring. It is anticipated the three Competition Directors will work in collaboration to develop the draw for the coming season in an effort to commence this process

### Coaching Report

As this was my first year as the Coaching Director on the board, I found it challenging, frustrating and at times very rewarding.

We held a Coach the Coaches course put on by ALA over a weekend and had 14 coaches attend from various clubs. It was well received by the people who attended. I also had the chance to work with some great coaches, managers and other staff who are passionate about the game we all love and want to see it succeed. I know lacrosse is only an amateur sport and all personnel are volunteers, but we need to introduce some more professionalism into what we are trying to achieve in lacrosse in this State, so we can be the No.1 State in Lacrosse in Australia.

#### State and Zone Teams.

With changes in processes for 2011, we are calling for coaches now and want them appointed before the end of this year—earlier than before, allowing them as much lead time to prepare their team as they deem necessary. We are also making the positions of coaches, managers etc a 2 year term to give the some continuity and to enable them to work with teams for a longer period to develop player's futures and to help make our teams stronger. Not only are applications coming in earlier, but we now are in the strong position that we are experiencing multiple applicants for some teams and will be interviewing coaches for the first time, to help grow and make our sport and make it more professional. This is a very healthy state for our sport.

I would also like to thank all the coaches, managers and all other support staff who put their hand up to coach the State and Zone Teams in 2010. We had some great success this year with the Senior and U/21 Women's Teams winning their respective championships and other teams also played off in their respective grand finals, well done.

#### Processes.

As I said earlier in my report, we have put together a new process on how we are going to appoint state and zone team coaches, managers etc. We are also looking at putting together a tool for all coaches to use to select their teams. This will include fitness and skills protocols that will help the coaches select their teams and give them some valuable information to give to their players to help them with their lacrosse in the future. Hopefully these changes will continue to be implemented, modified and added to, as a part of the continuing development of our coaching fraternity and professionalism in lacrosse.

#### Moving Forward.

We need all clubs to place an expectation onto their coaching staff to undertake the coach accreditation courses that Lacrosse SA offers, or any other Lacrosse accreditation courses available, to help them gain as much expertise as possible and achieve what they want to from coaching. Better coaches lead to better athletes. As coaches we expect our player's to perform at their best, so we as coaches should do the same, to give our player's the best chance to reach their goals.

In closing I'd like to thank Helen for her administrative work that so ably supported my role on the Board. I would like to thank all members of the Board, as like me we are all volunteers and do this job for the love of the sport. Thanks once again.

### Officiating

One of my first goals upon being elected to the Director Officiating position on the board of Lacrosse SA was to re-establish the Officiating Sub-Committee. This Sub Committee consists of members of SAWLUA and ALRA SA, and has met twice this season to discuss issues relating to Womens' Umpires, Mens' Referees and Minor Officials such as Scorers and Time Keepers. These meetings have enabled Lacrosse SA to better understand the problems facing the officiating organisations. These being; the difficulty in recruiting new umpires and referees, the attrition rate of our existing aging group of officials, unsporting behaviour of players, spectators and team officials, difficulty in accrediting new officials, survival of SAWLUA.

Bylaw Amendments to help alleviate some of these problems have been discussed at length by the Board. A number of new bylaws and amendments have been agreed to encourage the clubs to supply officials for every team that is nominated. The use of *Player Umpires/Referees* is to be discouraged in favour of the nomination of Club Umpires/Referees. The distinction between Player and Club Umpires/Referees is that Club Umpires/Referees agree to be regularly allocated to officiate as their first priority, before playing or coaching. (But not exclusively.)

Prior to the commencement of the field season Lacrosse SA in conjunction with members of ALRA SA presented an Officiating Training Day at the East Torrens Payneham Lacrosse Club. The subjects that were presented were Reporting Procedures, Conflict Management, and Scorers & Time Keepers (Minor Officials) Procedures. 24 officials attended what was a very successful day. Many thanks to Michael Bendall, who assisted in the organisation of the day, and to my co-presenters, David Campbell from ALRA, and Ms Chris Jefferys from Community Mediation Services. Many thanks also to Peter Vickery and the ETP club members who provided the excellent facility and food and drinks for the attendees.

Training and accreditation of Umpires and Referees was conducted by SAWLUA and ALRA during the season. It is my intention to develop, with the assistance of David Eyre, a basic online rules testing facility whereby nominated club referees and umpires can obtain a minimum rules accreditation.

The Match Incident Report booklets were developed printed and distributed at the beginning of the season. These A5 size booklets are used to inform all affected parties as to the details of the Report at the time of the incident. They can be used across all forms of lacrosse played under Lacrosse SA. They are intended to be used in conjunction with the Detailed Match Incident Report form which is downloadable from the Lacrosse SA web site.

I have organised for the current Rules of Men's, Women's and Junior Field Lacrosse to be uploaded to the Lacrosse SA website. I intend to do this for Indoor Lacrosse (iLax) and Box Lacrosse also.

Lacrosse SA has implemented an Unsporting Behaviour Policy. The purpose of which is to make it clear that Lacrosse SA does not tolerate physical or verbal abuse, of or by, any participants or spectators, at lacrosse matches run by Lacrosse SA. The policy empowers and directs match officials to intervene and apply the rules of Lacrosse and Lacrosse SA in resolving these situations.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all Senior and Junior Women's Umpires and Men's Referees. In particular I would like to especially thank all the Scorers and Timekeepers who volunteer their time to sit in variable weather conditions for the benefit of others. These generous people require your support in providing them with adequate equipment and shelter so that they can do their role efficiently and in a little comfort. The growth of Lacrosse in South Australia is limited by the number of people willing to volunteer their time to Coach, Manage and Officiate the sport. The number of people willing to officiate Women's and Men's Lacrosse matches continues to decline as our officials get older or dissatisfied with the behaviour of players and spectators toward them. We need to encourage and recognise the efforts of those who take on this role. If we do not, our competitions will shrink and the cost of officiating will escalate. This will have the effect of increasing the cost of playing the game as officials are remunerated out of the Team Fees Lacrosse SA charges the clubs.

It is in all our interests to find and recruit new officials every year. In doing so we will enable the game to expand beyond the number of teams and clubs we have today.

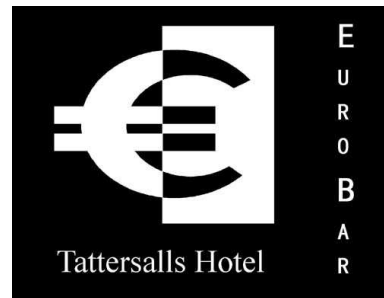
