The Sub Committee met over the season and discussed various issues to ensure communication and professionalism was maintained across the women's competition, with monthly reporting back to the Lacrosse WA Board. Our Committee does not meet as often as we probably should, this is just one of the areas that I will need to drive for further improvement in 2016.

This year we conducted two umpiring clinic sessions. The aim was to provide some basic rule information and interpretation to players and coaches of all levels. The session was very well attended with participants from all clubs. Attendees left with an umpiring booklet providing useful umpiring information and this was also forwarded to club contacts for dissemination to all members. Our second Clinic was facilitated by visiting Canadian International umpire, Cheryl MacNeill. Cheryl provided a more in-depth look at some of our rules and whilst attendance was still good, I had hoped that more of our regular weekly club umpires had been in attendance to improve their rule knowledge and application.

In 2017 I hope to conduct these umpiring sessions prior to the season with all players required to attend one. It is imperative that ALL players work to improve the standard of umpiring. Each week I hear and witness instances where incorrect rule applications have occurred, this is frustrating for all players, coaches and spectators and EVERYONE needs to take responsibility for this. Currently the bulk of our umpiring is undertaken by a small group, if we continue to have players put their heads in the sand with the idea that it is someone else's problem we will never improve.

The Women's Sub Committee is appreciative of the work carried out by the Junior Lacrosse Council. The change in junior age gradings was a terrific success and should take our junior competitions from strength to strength. Our new 9's competition was fun for all competitors and the player's skill development was terrific to witness. Whilst numbers remained low in this grade it did not deter our youngest members (and their parents). Their commitment on show with participants needing to get to the ground before 7.30 most Sunday's to prepare the fields. The 9s season culminated in an end of year presentation which was enjoyed by both players and parents.

2016 DIRECTOR OF OFFICIATING REPORT

Lacrosse WA's prime goal is recruitment.

Similarly for officiating.

Therefore, last year's excellent initiative of the recruitment, supporting and training of young officials has continued into 2016. We continue to owe a great deal of thanks to Grant Moir, Nicole McKenna and Stephanie McRae who were the prime supporters of this scheme. Also, many clubs actively support this move. Officials from both men and women's lacrosse provide advice and support. We now have a large group of young, experienced officials who are ready to move up through the junior grades and hopefully eventually into the seniors.

The aim is always to build a group of well-trained officials to manage the games at all levels.

To do this we need to provide a safe environment where officials are treated with respect and dignity.

Until recently the women's game provided this environment and heckling was seen as totally unacceptable. This is being eroded. Most forcibly demonstrated at the recent Under 15 Tournament. Whilst watching one game I heard people cheering and clapping when a young girl was yellow carded. Displays of poor sportsmanship continued throughout the game.

The concern in both forms of the game is that people believe that officials deliberately favour one team. Until we accept that officials are not perfect, but are trying to carry out their duties to the best of their abilities lacrosse will continue to stagnate or die.

If you believe that the officials could be better, then what are you doing to help?

Over the summer the plan is to review the progress of officiating in WA. Last year we had a very successful coming together of officials to plan for the ALA Conference. We are in the process of setting up a five or sixmember Officiating Committee.

At time of writing no one has officially accepted their invitation to join this committee.

Some things that will be considered:

- Structure of officiating organisations
 - o ALRA(WA)
 - o Women
 - How can each model enhance the other
 - o Grow together
- Larger role in managing the officials
 - Determining number of umpires, TDs, referees & assessors attending carnivals etc as we must pay for their travel
 - Playing role in selection
- Payment of officials
 - o in 2017 we are budgeting to increase women's payments
- Safe officiating environment
 - Player behaviour
 - Spectator behaviour
- Recruitment & retention strategies

Thank you all for your support and providing me with the chance to be involved at this level so that I can help provide opportunities for many to help us grow the game we love.

2016 DIRECTOR OF HIGH PERFORMANCE

2016 was a great year for the LWA High Performance portfolio and first and foremost I would like to thank everyone involved including the players, coaches, managers, officials, administrators and event organisers.

Following the 2015 adoption of the LWA High Performance Strategy we set about implementing some elements from the Strategy. From an administrative point of view we have established a High Performance Committee and engaged with the Department of Sport and Recreation to undertake a comprehensive review of the LWA High Performance Program.

We are continuing to focus on and develop the following areas as per the Lacrosse WA High Performance Strategy:

- U15's Talent Identification and Development
- U18's High Performance Development
- Seniors High Performance Development
- Coaching Development and Mentoring
- Manager Mentoring and Education Program
- Officiating Liaising with Director of Officiating
- LWA Uniform Policy and Sponsorship

The year started off very strongly for WA with the 2016 ALA U18 National Championship being held in Perth with an extremely well organised event run by East Fremantle Lacrosse Club. Congratulations to both our u18 WA Girls and Boys teams and Head Coaches Alana Mckinlay and Thomas Graham (and their assistants) for becoming the 2016 Australian Champions. A truly great effort from all involved with both teams. Congratulations go to the following players; Sharn Muffett, Dhevan Manu, Emily Wills, Karri Somerville, Emma Graham and Libby Blair who made the 2016 ALA U18 Girl's All Star Team. Alana McKinlay was named All Star Coach and Kellie Morley All Star Umpire. Ted Herbert, Ashby Dennis, Declan Pittway and Matt Wood were named on the 2016 ALA U18 Boy's All Star Team and Thomas Graham was named All Star Coach. Sharn Muffett and Declan Pittway were also named MVP's of the Championship.

Our senior state team campaigns were focused on this being a development year particularly for the women's team. Playing international games against England, as well as the Australian Championship saw the women's team take 18 players instead of the usual 16 to Melbourne. Included in this team were underage players, Rhiannon Panting and Emily Wills. Head Coach, Dennis Banyard, Team Manager Faye Beaman and the senior players must be acknowledged and congratulated for their ability to create a great team who developed enormously through the experience. The development nature of the women's team and some narrow losses for the men's team saw both teams finish third in the Championship. Congratulations to the following players who made their respective 2016 ALA Senior All Star Teams; Ashtyn Hiron, Bec Banyard, Elizabeth Hinkes, Lachlan Walker, Callum Mortimer and Alex Brown. Peter Mulcahy was named ALA All Star Referee.

The Under 15 Tournament was hosted by Glenelg Lacrosse Club and Lacrosse SA in October. WA was represented by the Stars and Flames girl's teams and the Southern Braves and Northern Thunder boy's teams. The Stars finished 2nd (going down by 1 goal in a very close Grand Final) and the Flames 8th after illness took its toll. Northern Thunder went down in the Grand Final to finish 2nd and Braves finished 3rd. Congratulations to Head Coaches Gerard Wills, Gavin Leavy, Hannah Brown, Dhevan Manu, Matt Angwin and Warren Brown.

This year's U15 Tournament also saw the introduction of the Girls Invitational Development Tournament which ran alongside at the same grounds. This was an initiative and partnership of LWA and LSA. The tournament was

contested by the Breakers Team from WA, two SA teams and a Presidents team (which included players from NSW, Victoria and SA). Congratulations to the young WA Breakers team and their coaches Emily Wills and Maddy Koelmeyer for winning the tournament and coming home with the tournament medals. The future is looking very bright with these young stars coming through!

All in all it was a great week with over 120 West Aussies all travelling to Adelaide on the same flight. An overwhelming number of compliments were made about the on and off field performances and behaviour of all WA teams and staff at this event.

Mention and congratulations must also be given to Paul Buckman and his team of coaches and organisers who implemented the u15 Development Squad for the boys this year. It was a very successful trial as was the girl's squad trial from the previous year. This is something that we will be looking to continue into the future.

2016 was also a big year on the International level with the 2016 FIL World U19 Men's Lacrosse Championship held from 23 Jul-1 Aug in Coquitlam, Canada. Players selected from Western Australia were Wembley's Keegan Davies, Sam Koczwara, Brayden Panting, Matt Wood, Wanneroo's Declan Pittway and Luke Walton and from East Fremantle Ryan Hockey. Team Personnel included Assistant Coach Gavin Leavy and Assistant Manager Roxanne Leavy both from East Fremantle, Physiotherapist, Jenna Wood and Referee, Wanneroo's Peter Mulcahy.

Australia finished fourth in the Championship moving up in world rankings for the first time in 12 years. Wembley's Sam Koczwara was given the huge honour of receiving the Spirit of Lacrosse Award and was the Australian flag bearer for the team – Congratulations to the team and staff - WA is very proud of you all!

Our next steps are to continue with the staged development of aspects of the High Performance Strategy, continue with the High Performance Committee, implement recommendations from the DSR High Performance review, participate in the review of the current ALA Championships and Tournaments and continue to further foster relationships with LSA, LV and the ALA.

Thank you to Murray Gates and the LWA Board and office staff for continually supporting the LWA High Performance area and congratulations to all who were involved. The time and dedication by the coaches, managers, officials, players and parents is acknowledged and greatly appreciated.

2016 DIRECTOR OF PROMOTION'S REPORT

2016 was yet another solid, but challenging one from a promotional perspective with some great achievements.

One of the highlights of the year was the launch of the new Lacrosse WA web site. This was the culmination of several years of hard work and persistence to finally get this over the line. Particular thanks must go to Roxanne Leavy for all her hard work in making this project a reality.

The new website provides a single point of reference on-line for all things lacrosse in Western Australia. The site is a much more intuitive, user friendly experience and will continue to grow and develop to ensure it meets the needs of our members and friends.

One of the obvious challenges we face in the marketing space is the limited budget and resources we have available to tell our story. Facebook is one of our primary channels of engagement with our target audience and 2016 saw a slow and steady growth in our engagement through this channel. We now have in excess of 1,400 page likes, a growth of more than 20% over 2015 – which is great result.

The Men's Under 19 World Championship in Canada this year provided an opportunity to generate some local press interest with a number of stories being run across several local community newspapers.

Similarly the 2016 ALA Under 18 Boy's and Girl's National Championships were hosted by East Fremantle Lacrosse Club in 2016. The tournament proved to be a very successful one for WA with both the men's and women's team being crowned national champions, which was a fantastic effort.

Our challenge for the season ahead remains consistent with this year – attempt to get cut-through in a complicated media and marketing landscape with very limited resources.



2016 DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT

Bill Barton Jnr

Firstly I will start by saying I came to the role late, much of the work was being undertaken by others and I wish to thank them for staying on and assisting throughout the year in various parts of the role that I would have been requested to take on.

To do a brief report, I started out wanting to change the way we recruit, to inspire clubs to undertake recruitment, for them to think outside of their current paradigm around recruiting. The role of development however encompasses much more than this.

Things we achieved.

- 1. We started having recruitment as a main focus and got half our recruitment discussion done.
- 2. Heathway funding was guaranteed for another year albeit the amount continues to drop each year.
- 3. We have recognised a number of things that each club can take away to deal with around recruitment and retention structures.

What still needs to be done:

- 1. I believe that the Healthway lacrosse clinics need to be facilitated by players from the clubs that are closest to the schools. However, to do this every club needs at least 5 people trained and ready to go. Also a central co-ordinator needs to ensure that clubs are doing the right thing, continue to allocate clinics appropriately and to deal with breakdowns in the system.
- 2. Clubs need to have more than one person responsible for recruitment and retention, and its needs to be the main focus of every club.
- 3. I believe that clubs should be moving forward together in a similar structure so that we can all tweak it together and it works for everyone.
- 4. Clubs need to re-introduce modcrosse for age groups 5-9. There is no doubt in my mind that modcrosse is the easiest way to ensure that we can gain the leverage in player numbers to create sustainable lacrosse clubs.

I am not going on with the development position, mostly due to work commitments, but also I don't see the clubs having a main focus on recruitment and until they do the impact that is possible is minimal.

Lacrosse WA, funded by Heathway, coordinates a 'Smarter than Smoking' School Modcrosse Program. This includes modcrosse sessions in school and after school hours, with community groups, at Lightning Carnivals, and any other special event including high priority groups. LWA monitors and adheres to Healthway's requirements which include no co-sponsorship with fast food and alcohol companies, smoke free lacrosse environments, safe alcohol and sunsmart practices, healthy canteens and the provision of a safe and inclusive environment for members.

School Modcrosse Program In 2016 the 'Smarter than Smoking' (STS) modcrosse program started the year with Anna Forrest centrally coordinating modcrosse clinics with the schools, clubs and Development Officers (DO) to deliver modcrosse to the list of high priority schools provided by clubs. Peta Hiron continued her role liaising with Healthway, managing funding money recording the number of schools and children exposed to STS Modcrosse, DO payments, and equipment maintenance and distribution.

The central coordinator is a significant role, which unfortunately was not able to be financed either by Healthway, LWA or the clubs. From July, after the majority of the schools' work was done, Anna Forrest resigned and the coordinator's role reverted back to the clubs to organise any further school modcrosse sessions. Anna provided a professional and systematic approach to the STS program, one which Healthway preferred. Anna is to be commended for her hard work and countless volunteer hours she spent organising the schools and the DO's work for the 18 months she was in the position. Her contribution has meant that all clubs benefited from her and the DO's work, with very little administration work required from clubs.

In 2016, LWA were fortunate to have a healthy number of 'Smarter than Smoking' Development Officers from various clubs, including a number of American players who wanted to run clinics. Up to 3 modcrosse sessions per class were offered to schools with an addition of the Quick Stix program, a new after school program which Healthway partially funded. Quick Stix is a nationally approved program developed in Victoria and will be formally rolled out by the ALA to LWA early next year. It involves running an hour afterschool program, which culminates in a carnival like final day, where the local club can enrol prospective players.

Unfortunately there was not the funds to fully launch the Quick Stix program with a coordinator, but with the assistance of Healthway and volunteer coordinators, Phoenix, Subiaco and Bayswater have trialled the program, and East Fremantle hopes to in Term 4.

Below is a summary of all work conducted throughout the year. Wanneroo Club received some one off funding from the City of Joondalup, which meant the STS modcrosse program did not have to fund up to 6 carnivals this year, and could devote the funds to further school clinics in Term 4.



2016 WA LACROSSE FOUNDATION REPORT

Cameron Blair – WALF Chairman

The board of the LWAF is made up of Mr Murray Gates (President LWA) Mr Michael Ferguson (Past President WALA), Mr Bruce Banyard (Director of Officiating LWA) and myself. On behalf of the Trustees I wish to thank Mr Steven McCrae for his past contribution and prudent guidance within the LWAF over several years. Steven's term ended last year.

Earlier in the year we investigated various other Bank Term deposit offers. It was found that there was only a marginal difference and frankly the time and effort required to re-organize the funds was not warranted. Interest rates remain historically low in the current investment marketplace.

Given that our charter is to be foremost prudent in our investment strategy, we continued to invest in solid Term Deposits and in turn received a small interest payment with the ANZ. Our base capital has been preserved by these interest payment(s), even after the allocation of a significant grant this year.

In 2015/16 the LWAF was approached by Mr Ian Toy to contribute the cost of editing a History project some 20 plus years in the making. This book has been released for sale and the outcome is a credit to both Mr Toy (Past President of WALA) and the Kuljak Lacrosse Club. Copies of this publication have also been distributed widely to Libraries around Western Australia.

In June 2016 an informal enquiry was made by the Director of Officiating for sponsorship towards a mentor programme for young Officials. A subsequent formal application was not received. No other formal applications, sadly were received.

For future reference the current LWA website provides guidelines for applications and the application form itself. The LWAF is always open to ideas that promote Lacrosse in WA for the benefit of all clubs in particular or the game in general. We encourage the Lacrosse community to examine these guidelines before making an application.



2016 O.C. Isaachsen Trophy Recipient – Thomas Graham

This year's O.C. Isaachsen Trophy recipient was Thomas Graham from Bayswater Lacrosse Club. The Isaachsen Trophy is awarded by ALA to the Fairest and Best player Australia-wide in the most senior men's State competition home and away qualifying round matches, based on votes awarded by match referees. The two time Australian representative is currently on the 2018 Australian Men's Squad who will be competing at the 2018 FIL Men's World Championship in Manchester, England. This is the second time Thomas has won this award, also being honoured in 2013.




U18 West Australian Boy's and Girl's State Teams -




