The Isaachsen Trophy is awarded to the fairest and best player Australia-wide in the most senior men's State competition home and away qualifying round matches, based on votes awarded by match referees.

This year's trophy was won by joint State League Fairest and Best Award winners Brad Goddard (Wembley) and Cam Evangelho (East Fremantle).

In claiming the 2018 trophy, midfielder Goddard becomes the first player to win the Isaachsen at two different clubs after he won the Isaachsen in 2010 whilst a member of East Fremantle. Goddard is the second Wembley player to bring home this prestigious award. As for Evangelho, the attackman with the laser of a shot who hails from California, he becomes the first US born player to win the award since 1986 and the seventh East Fremantle player to win the award.

2018 DIRECTOR OF OFFICIATING REPORT

Kellie Morley

In my 2017 Report I acknowledged that steps would need to be taken to improve officiating in 2018. Whilst some improvements have been made – there is still a lot we can do as a lacrosse community to improve the standard and game environment for officiating.

It is a difficult Director position, one that stretches across both men's and women's lacrosse, however because the men's officiating side is mainly operated through ALRA I have not spent any time delving into their processes and procedures. I will endeavour to make steps towards a united Officiating portfolio if elected into the position again for 2019/2020.

Under the guidance of Bev Leavy, LWA's Junior Officiating Program continued to evolve and we have now seen the second series of graduates through Phase 3 of our Junior Officials program. These officials have now participated in the program for three or more years and continue to improve through their weekly game and feedback sessions.

Whilst continuing to build on the Junior Officiating Program our focus now splits to improving knowledge and on field application for officials. It is our Clubs responsibilities to work hard to encourage and work hard to increase the number of accredited men's and women's officials. This year a concerted effort was put towards increasing the number of accredited women's officials. This was mainly due to the firm stance that our Regulations would be adhered to, ie loss of Premiership points if clubs did not comply with the minimum number of accredited officials. All clubs met or exceeded these levels this season. The Women's junior competition officiating also saw major improvement following the Board's endorsement of a Senior Accredited Official on each game. Congratulations to all our newly accredited officials in 2018.

Over the off season I will discuss ways forward with the ALRA for men's officials and conduct accreditation clinics for women's umpires.

On a National level, Lacrosse WA once again provided a number of officials to attend ALA Championships and Tournaments. These officials take leave from their employment and families, along with associated accommodation costs to ensure their own further professional development and maintain national level accreditation. All referees and umpires performed admirably and are to be congratulated on their professional approach to these Championships and Tournaments.

LWA were also represented on the world stage this year with three on field referees (Blair Fraser, David McRae and Steve McRae) and off field officials (Evan Walters and Peter Mulcahy) attending the FIL Men's World Championship in Netanya, Israel.

I wish our aspiring women's World Championship U19 umpires the best of luck as they wait to hear if their nominations for Peterborough, Canada in 2019 have been approved, similarly our umpire and referee nominees for the ASPAC's in Korea.

Thank you all for your support and providing me with the chance to be involved at this level so that I can help provide opportunities for many to help us grow the game we love along with improving the standard of our match officials.

2018 DIRECTOR OF HIGH PERFORMANCE

2018 brought many changes across the board for LWA High Performance. This started first and foremost with the re-creation of the High Performance Committee. Our goal at the close of last year was to create a more sustainable structure within our High Performance State Teams. This has involved an in-depth look into how we can improve our support to the various state teams and how we can improve communication within our community. In order to give each of our teams the best chance to be competitive at a national level, we have increased the standards to which we hold ourselves as a committee and our coaching and managing staff.

Looking to the future, we hope to continue to grow in the following areas in 2019.

- Coaching continual mentoring and support in ongoing development
- U15's Coach Development and High Performance Skill Development
- U18's High Performance Skill Development and introduction of a structured Strength and Conditioning Program
- Seniors High Performance Development and Professionality of Standards

Our National campaign started in Adelaide with our National U18's representatives competing for their respective titles in April. Tegan Brown led her team undefeated to the Grand Final game, but went down by one goal to Victoria. The Men's side, led by Head Coach Gavin Leavy, improved their previous standing to also finish in second place. Fantastic efforts by both of the teams and congratulations to the following players for being named in their respective All-Stars teams: Madison Copeland, Erin Mitchel, Libby Blair, Olivia Antulov, Lucas Koczwara, Will Czynski, and Shane Thomason.

Our Senior State teams participated in a home tournament hosted by Wembley Lacrosse Club this past July. Both the Senior Men's and Senior Women's team improved to playing in the Grand Final games. The Men's side, under Head Coach Nathan Rainey, had a rough tournament with injuries and ended up going down in the Grand Final game. The Women's side led by Head Coach Travis Roost, went on to win the National Championship by one goal. Congratulations to the following players for being named in their respective All-Star Teams: Elizabeth Hinkes, Jess Kennedy, Alana McKinley, Courtney Ackland, Mitchel Kennedy, Brock Beall, and Cam Evangelho, as well as Travis Roost for winning All-Star Coach.

The Under 15's Tournament took place this year in Victoria and boasted 10 teams on the women's side and 9 teams on the men's side. The Flames improved to 6th under Head Coach Gavin Leavy. Emily Wills stepped into the Head Coach role this year for the Stars and finished 8th.

On the men's side, after losing more than half of their experienced players, the Northern Thunder managed to finish in 5th place. The Southern Braves went into the Grand Final game having lost only one game during the tournament. In the final game of the tournament, the Braves won in overtime to take home the Tournament Trophy.

Mitchel Kennedy, Brock Beal, Ryan Spark, Isaac Cahill, Lachlan Walker, Thomas Graham, Callum Robinson, Stuart Bentley, Ben Muxlow and Co-Captain Alex Brown had a wonderful tournament in Israel with Glenn Morley as the Assistant Coach and Phil Ackland as the Statistician for the Sharks. Australia went down to the Iroquois Nation in the Bronze medal game, maintaining their previous standing.

This November, WA is also sending over an Indoor team to the National Championship, lead by Head Coach Wade Hammond. This is the first year since 1980 that LWA has sent a team to the tournament. WA just missed out on the championship game by one goal and the boys are looking forward to next year.

Executive Summary

The Alkimos "Pirates" Lacrosse Club was formed with the vision of growing the game of lacrosse in the Lacrosse WA Perth region. With support from the local Wanneroo council and the potential of a future sporting precinct, the new club found it's home in Alkimos and was granted the fields of Heath Park Eglinton. Through the generosity of the lacrosse community, Alkimos received equipment and cash donations to assist with the establishment process. Governance structures such as Incorporation, club rules, budgets, policies and procedures have all been embedded into club operations. The club has a very positive, family based culture with membership to support a full committee, two senior teams (men's and women's) and a modcrosse competition. The club has finished an extremely successful inaugural year in every context. Financially, the club made a modest operating profit while maintaining the full worth of the donations received in the club bank. Membership grew substantially throughout the year supporting 4 teams of Modcrosse, women's growth from 8 players to 15 and men's sustaining a full quota. The club goal of no forfeits of any fixture games was achieved.

Club Establishment Report

In August of 2017 we started the journey to establishing a new lacrosse club in Western Australia. A feat that had not been achieved in over 40 years. After creating an Alkimos "Pirates" Lacrosse Club Facebook page and promoting the concept at the 2017 LWA Grand finals and U15's National Tournament, the concept created a movement that gained momentum an transformed an idea into creation. The formation of a new club received wide ranging support through endorsement, gifts of equipment and some much appreciated cash donations from the WA lacrosse community.

On Sunday the 15th of October 2017, the first official gathering of people interested in becoming involved in the new club took place at aptly named The Boat, Mindarie with the attendance of over a dozen interested potential members. The club's next meet was the official launch on Friday the 3rd of November 2017 at the Shorehaven Café, Alkimos, where over 50 participants came to celebrate the creation of the Pirates and vote in the steering committee.

Efforts by the club to promote and educate the local community about lacrosse through Sunday morning Summercrosse sessions by Alkimos Beach, School Coaching Clinics and exposure at local community events had fortunately provided a number of entirely new participants who were keen to try something new and exciting in their area. This new local and family oriented participation was a primary focus of the Alkimos Lacrosse Club. As with any fledgling club, our biggest challenges involved membership base, resources and revenue. An additional early focus was to establish the appropriate governance structures, a values driven culture and a social atmosphere.



Our very successful School Clinics Program was coordinated by Mark Griffiths and funded through Heathway, Quick Sticks and LWA which saw over 260 hours of clinics run in 15 schools with over 880 students. This program provided the pipeline feeder to our grass roots Modcrosse Program coordinated by Hamish McKay who nurtured the fledgling laxers with an inclusive and fun experience for all ages.

Our 8 junior lacrosse teammates playing in the Senior Men's Division three and Women's Division 2 teams, all played major roles with four girls making the Regional under 15s Lacrosse team played in Melbourne early October. The Men's team won 2 games and drew 2 while the Women's team had all opponents praising their spirit and abilities throughout the whole season.

The club has gained respect from both the WA lacrosse world community and the local Alkimos community with the Pirates supporting a number of events with practical help. Clubs, businesses and groups that provided tangible support to Alkimos included Lacrosse WA, Phoenix LC, Bayswater LC, Wanneroo-Joondalup LC, Wanneroo Modcrosse LC, Wembley LC, East Fremantle LC, Kuljak LC, Butler Bridgestone B Select, Fleet Brothers, Rose Family, Griffiths Family, Toy Family, Jobson family and the Holman Family.





Looking to 2019


We have continued our Planning Sessions for 2019. We will be looking at a range of areas the club intends to focus on, as detailed in the Club Vision Document:

1. Increase in Junior men player numbers and teams.

Our Mod-X program continues to go from strength to strength, with several families committed, as well as fielding a full team and a bench in the Wembley modcrosse competition. We will be looking to refresh our modcrosse offering in 2019 by reducing the number of on field players, reducing complication and reducing the size of the field to improve their modcrosse experience by inspiring participation (as less on field players allows and encourages more on field time, space, running and opportunity to develop skills and confidence) and increasing number of teams (by reducing the number of on field players with shorter fields).



8. Completion of Operational Plan 2015 to 2018
Many of the objectives and action plans have been executed with mixed results. We will renew our strategy and operational plan so we can align and maintain our structure, focus and activities from 2019.

Our areas for improvement and focus in 2019

1. Low number of Junior Women players.

We fielded only fielded one Junior Women's team for the length of the season. Our thanks again to Wembley for their support and sharing the common goal for us all to do what we can to keep players involved and maintain great lacrosse experiences for players and parents. We have increasing concern in being able to field teams in 2019 with the inclusion of the Women's 15's grade (currently only 13's and 17's). Our key actions:

- Tailoring our programs to align with the school curriculum and assessments, and customer needs by engaging with our customers (local schools) to really understand what they need, works and can be better.
- 2. Decrease in Senior Men and Division 2 players.

Division 2 players returning to Phoenix as they re-entered their Division 2 team was a big positive for Phoenix and lacrosse overall. Some players from the previous season did not return mostly due to work commitments. Low number of Division 2 resulted in most games being played with a reduced number of field players (e.g. 8 a side) and some forfeits.

The reduction of player numbers and experience did impact our numbers and on field experience. On too many occasions we needed to reduce on field player numbers to proceed with games. We thank all clubs for their support in reducing or providing players. Our key actions:

- Ongoing engagement with past senior players and encouragement of junior players to play up in Division 2 in 2019.
- Establishing working relationships with local university to understand the opportunities for how we can design and deliver providing lacrosse options to suit their various sports programs and student (customer) segments.

3. Smaller, shorter, quicker and more involved formats to increase attractiveness and participation of lacrosse.

We will be looking to trial smaller, shorter, quicker and more involved formats (e.g. half size field, 5 v 5 or 6 v 6, less players per team (more teams), shorter time periods) to understand the attractiveness and benefits for new and experienced players.

Observing the success of other sports to test and implement short formats of sports (e.g. 20/20 cricket) and in response to some perceptions and a reality that some forms of lacrosse are quite complex for prospective and new players, parents and spectators; reduced "ball contact" or "in play" time players have on larger and segregated fields; increased participation by having less players on a field; increased speed of transition and playing both ends / more positions.

Our key actions:

- Coordinate with interested players, teams and club during off season.
- Hold 2019 Gala Day at Rosalie Park for all clubs and teams.
- Test with our modcrosse teams.
- 4. Losing sight of what clubs and developing players, coaches and teaches need to understand, develop and grow lacrosse.

An area of concern observed and expressed during our AGM relates to the recent survey distributed by the Australian Lacrosse Association (ALA) and review of publically available information from the ALA website, that there is overweighted focus on the long and growing list of Australian representative teams at the expense of supporting the development and promotion of local and club lacrosse by the governing body. This does not appear to have proportional alignment with the ALA's Constitution Objects and Strategy for Lacrosse in Australia 2015 – 2018.

While scattered throughout endless online channels there is no single source for this information in Australia. In acknowledging and appreciating the materials available through Quick Stix Program, these materials are restricted and not freely available. We believe this should be a core responsibility and area of focus, overarching the association and governing body as illustrated by many other sports.

Our key actions:

- We are embarking on plan and process of developing and making freely available documents and videos that aligns to the pathways and needs of a players, parents, teachers or volunteers that will assist in understanding, coaching, teaching and developing the fundamental skills, positions, team play and tactics for the various forms of lacrosse.
- Working with local schools and university to develop and tailor modified lacrosse programs that can be delivered over a part of full term (4, 8 to 10 week programs) for them, with them or by them.
- Update our website and provide materials as they are finalised.




