

Lacrosse was born of the North American Indian. It was christened by the French, but adopted and raised by the Canadians. In all its full grace and beauty it has been wooed by athletes of the United States and the British Commonwealth. Practically all English-speaking nations have succumbed to its charm at one time or another. Queen Victoria of Great Britain found lacrosse "very pretty to watch", and former U.S. President William Howard Taft, the only president to attend a lacrosse game, enjoyed seeing it played. In Canada it was made the National Game by Act of Parliament, and in Australia it was termed "the Game of Thoroughbreds". In 1938 the famous American Sportswriter Grantland Rice was quoted as saying that it required more elements of skill than any other game he knew. - from THE LACROSSE STORY Alexander M.
