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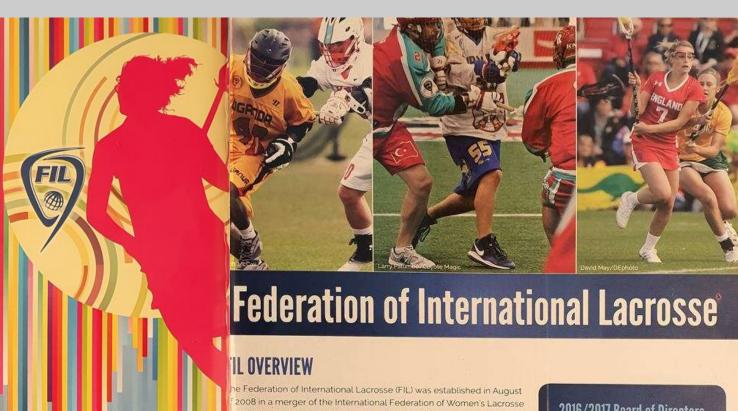

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INDOOR LACROSSE

Indoor (box) lacrosse is played on a standard sized arena floor and features six players (goaltender and five runners) competing in play at any time. Team roster sizes are 23. players (18 dressed). The strategy of indoor lacrosse is similar to that of basketball, with all five runners involved in the offense and the defense. Adding to the appeal are the speed. and excitement created by a 30-second shot clock. The combination of action and reaction makes box lacrosse as much funto play as it is to watch. Indoor lacrosse is currently played by Fil. members Australia Austria: Canada, Czech Republic, England, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Iroquois Israel, Latvia, Norway, Scotland, Serbia, Slovakia. Sweden. Switzerland. Turkey and the United States. The inaugural FIL World Indoor Lacrosse Championship (WILC) was hosted in Ontario, Canada in 2003 There are currently over 100,000 indoor players in the world. Both males and females play this version of lacrosse and the ages of competition range from 6-65 years. The next FIL WILC will be held 19-28 September 2019 in Langley, British Columbia, Canada,

MEN'S FIELD LACROSSE

Men's field lacrosse is played outdoors on a 110m x 60m field. Teams consist of 10 players of a team roster of 23 players. The team on the field consists of goaltender, three attack, three midfielders and three defense. Men's field is very similar to box in the fundamental skills of passing and catching and the physical nature of the play. The games differ in style of play and strategy. There is no controlling shot clock in men's field and the game is more strategic, relying more on possession and control of the ball. Every four years the Federation of International Lacrosse holds World Championships at the Junior (U-19) and Senior levels. Traditionally, Australia, Canada, England and the United States have battled for supremacy, but recent years have seen the emergence of high-quality teams from Asia and Europe There also has been an expansion of the game in Europe, Central America and Africa The next-FIL Men's World Championship will be held in Israel, 12-21 July 2018, with the FIL U-19 Men's World

Championship taking place 9-18 July 2020 in Castleroy, Limerick, Ireland

WOMEN'S FIELD LACROSS

Women's field tacrosse is a non-conti sport. In 2012, common markings for be women's and men's field were established on a 110m x 60m field. Teams are compris of 18 players (12 on the field - generally fo attack, four midfielders, three defense an goalkeeper). OFFICIAL HAND SIGNALS



BLOCKING on hips

open hands move hands in & out touching hips A player must not block, charge, barge, shoulder, push with the hand, back into an opponent, or force her way through a legal double team. A player's legal defense position is as wide as her shoulders. It includes the space in front of her, extending as far as the length of her arms outstretched directly in front of her. A defender holding this position before the attack player reaches her. and extending her hips or knees sideways to impede the attacking player.



CHARGE · one palm placed behind the head direction of play indicated with other arm It is charging if an attack player uses her body or crosse to intefere with and make body contact with a defender who is moving with her opponent to maintain legal body position.



COVER • arms extended in front of body · one arm on top of the other

A player must not cover a ground ball with her crosse or any part of her body when it prevents an opponent from making a legal play on the ball.



DANGEROUS FOLLOW THROUGH mimic holding

a crosse · mimic the follow through A player must not, at any time, follow through with her crosse in a dangerous or uncontrolled manner. A yellow card will be given for a dangerous follow through. Dangerous propelling will be signalled by the same motion. A player must not at any time propel the ball with her crosse in a dangerous or uncontrolled manner. A yellow card will be given for dangerous propelling.



DANGEROUS SHOT ON GK · one palm moved toward the face.

A player must not shoot dangerously or without control. A dangerous shot is usually directed at the goalkeeper. A dangerous shot is judged on any combination of the shooter's distance from the goal, the force of the shot, and the placement of the shot. A shot may be judged dangerous and / or uncontrolled even if it misses the goal.



OFFICIAL HAND SIGNALS



DETAINING

• Fists placed
at waist level
• one fist up
the other down
as if holding a
crosse

A player must not initiate illegal contact by detaining, holding or tagging, or pushing against an opponent's body, clothing, or crosse with her arm, leg or body. A player must not use the shaft of the crosse to hit, push or displace an opponent.



EMPTY CROSSE

OHEOX

right hand
brought together

with left hand
in a clapping

motion

A player must not check/tackle an opponent's empty crosse while the opponent is trying to gain possession of the ball. This rule applies when an opponent is attempting to play a ground ball or could have received a pass.



GOAL

• both arms
raised above head
lowered to chest
level pointing
loward the centre
of the field

A goal is scored when the whole ball passes completely over the whole goal line; between the goal posts and under the crossbar from the front; the ball having been propelled from an attack player's legal crosse; from a defender's crosse; or off a defender's body.



GOAL CIRCLE FOUL
• point to the goal circle.
• indicate direction of free position When a goal circle foul is awarded the direction of possession will be indicated.



HELD WHISTLE DIRECTION OF POSSESSION • arm held in direction of play When a free position is awarded for a minor or major foul the direction of possession will be indicated.



ILLEGAL BALL
OFF THE BODY
• indicated by
pointing to the

deliberately used

A player must not allow any part of her body to deliberately impede, accelerate or change the direction of the ball.

OFFICIAL HAND SIGNALS

A player must not strike an opponent with her crosse or force an opponent's crosse into an opponent's head or body.



ILLEGAL CHECK
TOWARD THE
HEAD
• a chopping
motion toward
the head

A player must not roughly or recklessly check/tackle an opponent's crosse. Players must not check an opponent's crosse from within a field crosse width of player's head (a distance of approx 18cm or the width of the player's shoulders). The direction of the check must be away from a player's head/neck, and checks must be controlled, not intimidating or dangerous.



NO GOAL

• both arms
extended toward
the ground
swinging in and
out crossing each
other

A goal is not scored when:

- 1) the ball is put in the goal by a non-player, including the official
- 2) the ball comes off the person/body of an attack player
- 3) the ball enters the goal after a whistle is blown or the hooter has sounded
- 4) the attack shooter steps on or over the goal circle line or if any other attack player enters the goal circle
- 5) the goalkeeper is inside the circle and she or her stick is interfered with in any way by an attack player
- 6) the official rules a shot or follow-through as dangerous
- 7) the ball enters the goal while the attacking team has an illegal player on the field
- 8) the ball enters the goal from an attack player's illegal crosse
- 9) the player who shot the goal adjusts her crosse after an official's request for a pocket inspection; the crosse will be removed from the game
- 10) the ball is shot or otherwise put into the goal by the attacking team's goalkeeper
- 11) the ball enters the goal when the attacking team is offside.





OFFICIAL HAND SIGNALS



OBSTRUCTION
OF FREE SPACE
TO GOAL
• arms at chin level
• pains toward
frace
• one hand doser
to the frace

A defence player must not block or guard the goal outside the goal circle with any part of her body for the purpose of obstructing the free space to goal. This rule is only in effect when the attacking team is in possession of the ball within the 15m fan.



A team must not:

- have more than seven attack players below/goal side of the restraining line in their offensive/attacking end of the field.
- 2) Have more than eight defence players below/goal side of the restraining line in their defensive end of the field. One of these eight players is usually but not necessarily the goalkeeper.
- 3) players may exchange places during play, but a player must have both feet above/behind the restraining line before a teammate may move below/goal side of the restraining line. An illegal exchange is an immediate whistle.

 4) any part of a player's foot that is on or over the restraining line is a violation. Player's may reach over the
- line with their sticks to play the ball as long as their foot/ feet are not over the line.

 5) the restraining line rule remains in effect at all times,
- 5) the restraining line rule remains in effect at all times, for the entire game.

A player must not block, charge, barge, shoulder or push with the hand, back into an opponent, or force her way through a legal double team.



If both players draw illegally, or it cannot be determined why the draw was illegal, or an official determines that the draw was unsuccessful because it was not set correctly, the official will call time out to re set the draw.



A player must not strike an opponent with her crosse or force an opponent's crosse into an opponent's head or body.







SWIPE

arm moved in a circular motion around the head or

around the head from high to low across the body

A player must not swipe at her opponent with her crosse. A swipe is a reckless and dangerous swing of the crosse that has potential for serious injury. A swipe will be called regardless of whether or not contact is made with an opponents crosse or body.



3 SECONDS

• 3 fingers
raised

• palm facing
away

A defender must not remain in the marking area in front of the goal circle for more than 3 seconds unless she is marking an opponent within a sticks length. Only one defender may mark the same non-ball player in the marking area.



THROW

• fisted
hands
• thumbs up
• moved
upward

Two opposing players stand with their feet and crosses at least 1m apart. Each player stands nearer the goal she is defending and faces in toward the playing area. The official stands between 6-8m from the players and simultaneously blows the whistle and tosses the ball in a short high arc towards the players so they can catch or otherwise play the ball as they move toward the game. If the throw is inaccurate or is not touched by either player, it must be repeated.



TIME-OUT

• facing the timer

• arms crossed above the head

Each team may request two 90 second time-outs during regulation play and one time-out during overtime. A team may request a time-out after a goal is scored or when a team has possession of a "dead ball" anywhere on the field outside of the 15m fan. The coach may request the time-out through the score-table or the player who has possession of the ball may request the time-out through a field official.



WARD OFF

■ one forearm bent
■ arm moved
upward &
away from
the body

A player must not guard her crosse with her arm. If one hand is removed from the shaft of the crosse, an elbow or free arm may not be used to ward off an opponent deliberately or otherwise, with or without contact.
