The Australian Womens Lacrosse Council History

The first organized Womens Lacrosse in Australia was the formation of the Victorian Womens Lacrosse Association, in Melbourne, in 1936. By 1938, they had affiliated with the All England Womens Lacrosse Association, and in 1940 were seeking affiliation with the United States Womens Lacrosse Association.

However, the 1939-45 World War forced sport aside after that season, and it was not until late 1961 when moves were made simultaneously in both Melbourne, Victoria and Adelaide, South Australia, to revive Womens Lacrosse.

The first interstate Womens Lacrosse match was played in Adelaide, S.A. in 1962, as a curtain-raiser to the Mens Lacrosse Carnival there.

While in Adelaide, the Australian Womens Lacrosse Council (A.W.L.C.) was formed, with Victoria and South Australia the only members.

In 1965, the Mens Lacrosse Carnival was to be held in Perth, Western Australia, and the A.W.L.C. were invited to play their annual interstate match between Victoria and South Australia during the Carnival, as there was some interest in the womens game in Western Australia.

The Western Australians were persuaded to form an Association to join the A.W.L.C. and to enter a team in what became the first Womens Lacrosse Carnival.

This meant that the three States still flaying Mens Lacrosse (of the six States who had played pre-War), also had Womens Lacrosse Associations.

In 1976 the Tasmanian Womens Association was formed in Hobart, and unofficial teams represented Tasmania for experience, in Adelaide that year and in Melbourne in 1977.

In 1978 Tasmania became a full member of the A.W.L.C., and entered their first official team in the A.W.L.C. Championships, in Perth, W.A.

Regular Carnivals (now Championship) were held — at first every 3 years, then every 2 years and now yearly, as a result of quicker means of transport between the States:— Melbourne, Victoria is 450 miles from Adelaide and 2165 miles from Perth, Western Australia; and a 14-hour ferry trip across Bass Strait, or by plane to Hobart, Tasmania. They are held in each State in turn, over 10 days.

In 1970 the first Under 16 Championship was held, and in 1982 the first Under 19 Interstate match was played between Victoria and South Australia at the 1982 Senior Championship in Adelaide, S.A.

In 1985 the first Under 19 Championship was held with three States South Australia, Victoria, and Western Australia taking part. The Under 19 Championship is to be held every second year.
